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EXECUTIVE DIRECTOR REPORT

Tennis continued to see an enormous growth in participation by end of 2022 – with over 6 million new players joining the sport since 2019. Tennis grew by another 1 million players in just one year from 2021 to 2022. Whether it be COVID or a surge in interest in health activities, tennis is seeing a boom not seen since the 1980s.

With this boom in mind, at the end of 2021 our Board of Directors supported my request to enhance staffing to continue to bring quality programming of tennis and additionally pickleball to the state of Utah. With this support, the larger staff was now able to focus on each area of tennis in our community and "fill the gaps" where programming was needed but not currently being offered by our super busy providers.

Racquet Sports Industry magazine acknowledged how well the Intermountain Section is doing in providing great services and promoting growth to our sport by naming the Intermountain Section the National Section of the Year. We are so happy to know that our hard work is paying off with so many new people joining the game.

Trent Shorter, our new Northern Utah Area Coordinator, created many new USTA events up in the Logan area. He is such a people person and has a laugh that makes everyone smile. He is bringing this enthusiasm to juniors and adults by offering short format tournaments and socials. 2022 was the inaugural year for the Raspberry Open at Bear Lake that we hope becomes a new tradition for destination tournaments.

Cherstin Harris became not only the 10 & Under Manager but also the Junior Competition Manager in the year 2022. She brings an enormous fresh energy and thoughtfulness to offering the juniors many opportunities to play in high quality events. The junior pathway has changed dramatically in the last few years, with the USTA new tournament software offering many different formats for competition. The UTR product has also become a strong component to junior competition. Cherstin is deeply immersed in understanding how and why juniors like to compete and she offered short format 10 & Under events along with traditional Sectional tournaments like the Labor Day event. Mid-year the new WTN – World Tennis Number launched by the International Tennis Federation became a reality – allowing new methods for grouping players based on ability. This WTN number will most likely become a leading methodology in the future for both juniors and adults.

Jeremy Horner is our new Pickleball Manager. USTA Utah sees pickleball as a complementary racquet sport to tennis. We believe that the 2 sports grow each other with a huge crossover of participation from our adult players competing in both pickleball and tennis events. In addition, with infrastructure always a need for both sports, we hope to partner with pickleball to create more courts for both sports. The junior pathway for pickleball is currently non-existent and Jeremy has worked hard this past year to start creating a structure and opportunities for juniors to play with other juniors and not just adults as has been the case in the past. Jeremy ran the pickleball portion for the Of Love tournament this year with a growth in participation from 80 entrants to 200. He also ran successful Jingle Ball junior tournaments, a junior league, and a FIRST of its kind adult TEAM Pickleball League that had over 200 players. We believe that team league play is a natural evolution for the pickleball sport.

Ally Sundberg continues to find a way to handle the massive influx of league players to our state. Utah League play broke the 10,000 registrants mark this year — which is incredible. Most leagues continued to grow, although the Mixed leagues did see slight decrease in participation. The opening of SunPro Tennis and Pickleball has brought great opportunities for players in the southern part of our Salt Lake area to

have indoor courts at last, helping with taking care of players in our more southern part of the Salt Lake area.

Gretchen Soffe works with an energy level for creating new events that is unmatched. She is the absolute best at seeing a "hole" in programming and filling it with new products. She ran multiple short format tournaments during the year for both men and women. As people's schedules become more complex, and court time for traditional tournament formats is difficult to acquire, Gretchen offers the short format option so that competitive play can still occur. Gretchen grew the New to Tennis program with the help of our Community Coaching Team members during the summer. This introductory program, which focuses on fun took place at 3 sites during the summer. In addition, reaching out to the 20-somethings and 30-somethings to bring more players back to tennis after their junior years was a focus of her Young Adult Social Leagues.


Garrett Snyder has embraced the junior recreational player – creating so many opportunities for them to become more comfortable competing in a more casual setting than the traditional "Ranked" tournaments. He also offered short format competition days – called Junior Circuits that consistently sell-out. In addition, Garrett's focus on the high school player through special events just for them is greatly needed to keep our sport healthy in future years. These events bring players in from all areas of our community and allow them to compete and learn "how" to compete in our sport.

The year 2022 saw Anthony Panuzio leave as our Communications Manager and previous staff favorite Ashley Agrelius rejoined us from Colorado. Information changes so quickly and is constantly needing updating that Ashley works hard to keep the public informed on all things tennis in our state. Communicating and reaching each generation of player is different – with some preferring emails, other texts, and others social media reminders. It's always a goal of ours to reach as many people as possible and keep information current and flowing quickly.

As far as myself, as I finish my 10th year as Executive Director, I found myself moving away from "executing" events and more into managing the many spinning plates of our expanded organization. Darcy Tsandes, a former teaching pro with me in Park City, joined me as our Finance Manager to help keep straight the many revenues and expenses of our growing organization. I continue to run the Ardene Bullard Of Love tournament each year for juniors and adults along with now running the adult portion of the Utah State Open and Adult IceBreaker. The Of Love continues to grow — with over 1000 event registrants - I truly love the community's support of this amazing fundraising event and I feel the love of the players every year for these traditional historic tournaments.

Thank you for all you do to make our sport a joyful way to connect with people. Tennis is truly the sport of a lifetime – I know it has been for many years for me and I wish that joy for everyone in our community.





ADULT TOURNAMENTS

In 2021, a nationwide pathway for Adult Age division and NTRP tournaments was implemented which offered a universal ranking system aligned across the country. Rankings are produced weekly for Adult Age divisions as well as NTRP divisions. All rankings are now run from a national database and rankings can be found at https://www.usta.com/en/home/play/rankings.html#/tab=adult.

Junior Competition in Utah has unique challenges that require creative solutions. Due to limited courts, our high level players and more introductory players often compete in the same tournaments. In 2022, with new National tournament regulations and increased software capabilities, Utah was able to implement "flighting" for the large tournaments and created better play opportunities and more competitive matches for all players.

The International Tennis Federation introduced their new rating which is called the World Tennis Number (WTN) in June 2022. We were one of the first districts in our section and the nation to implement and use the WTN to improve the quality of the tennis matches at our tournaments.

We flighted all our large tournaments including the L6 Boys Icebreaker, L5 Of Love, and L4 Labor Day Sectional using WTN.

Young Adults Socials - We are pleased to offer engaging, social tennis events for Young Adults. These events, for 18-39 old players, are loaded with games, drills, and level-based match play. We had 148 participants in 2022 and will continue to grow this product.



USTA Junior Circuits is a singles program for juniors 13-18 years old. This entry-level tournament is a non-elimination, round-robin draw format. Players are grouped into flights based on their age and ability. This experience encourages players to develop their skills through level-based play and demonstrate good sportsmanship. Utah Tennis Association accommodated 299 participants at these popular events.

High School Tournament Series was created in 2020 when the boys high school season abruptly ended. Garrett wanted to create an opportunity for them to compete one last time. It was a success, and the series continues. This event encompasses a summer series of 2–3-day tournaments for boys and girls. Four events are offered: Varsity Singles, JV singles, doubles & mixed doubles. 98 participants

High School Camps are offered before the start of high school tennis seasons (Girls in summer and Boys in February) to hone skills of players. The successful



training camp includes 10 hours of on and off court instruction. In 2022, 128 players from 15 schools participated.

Outreach Committee

The Outreach Committee is committed to connecting with new and existing players. Committee members act as "tennis ambassadors" as we work towards assimilating new players into our existing culture.

One Day Sanctioned Events

The Men's events such as MUSCLE MX Tournament Series and SINGLES CHALLENGE saw approximately 170 participants in 2022. Utah Tennis Association is committed to bringing tennis to underserved areas such as Manti, Utah where 24 locals participated in a MUSCLE MX event.



One Day Social Events

The Women's 4SCORE Tournament continues to see success with over 300 players participating in our Spring and Fall Series. Participants enjoy donning accessories or costumes according to themes for each event. It is a relaxed, music-filled, socializing affair with a little tennis thrown in the mix.

Adult Tennis 101

Our participation initiatives begin at the Adult Tennis 101 Program with efforts to attract new players to the sport. Based at three local parks (Olympus Hills, Riverton City, and Farmington Shepard Park) Utah Tennis Association saw approximately 220 new players with many transitioning to USTA League play.

Pride Parade

Almost 200 people from the Utah Tennis community came out to be a part of the USTA UTAH parade contingent. The parade was met with a warm welcome by 70,000 participants this year. As we grow, so does our awareness of the need to continue our diversity and inclusion efforts.

Southern Utah

St. George saw 70 players participate in events like: New



Year's Day Social, Men's Singles Tournament, and a Mixed Doubles Tournament. Efforts continue to bring USTA Programming to Southern Utah.

ATTENTION TENNIS ENTHUSIASTS of Northern Utah: USTA UTAH is very excited to start our second year of tournaments in the Cache valley and surrounding areas. In 2022 we had promising turnout, with great

matches. We thank all who participated and look forward to seeing you again. We welcome more players to join in the competition. Our Northern Utah offerings include:

- June We hosted USTA UTAH'S first annual destination tournament (Raspberry Open). This unsanctioned event took place at Ideal Beach Resort in beautiful Bear Lake.
 Men, Women, and Mixed double divisions were fielded.
- July Cache Challenge. Adults & Level 6 Juniors tournament.
- August Logan Open. Adults & Level 6 Juniors tournament.
- Mid-September Dog Days of Summer. Level 6 Juniors only doubles tournament.



UTAH TENNIS FOUNDATION

The Utah Tennis Foundation is a 501c3 non-profit organization established in 1987. This organization, which works closely with the Utah Tennis Association, seeks to open doors to players who might not otherwise be able to afford the sport of tennis. Through our fundraising efforts and donations, the Utah Tennis Foundation was able to help hundreds of players in our state in 2022. The Utah Tennis Foundation has several areas of assistance for players and community partners.

- Grants: Parks and Recreation Departments, Private or Public facilities, and Community Champions can apply for up to a \$1000 grant available each year to help with programming, expenses, or player need in their area. Examples of grant money needs could be windscreens expenses, balls and equipment for subsidized programming, money to provide player gifts, end of season party assistance, or help in paying instructors for free community based programming. To apply for a grant, contact Laurie Lambert at llambert@utahtennis.com
- Player Scholarships: Based on family financial need, good sportsmanship, and stated goals for tennis development, players may apply to become a Utah Tennis Foundation sponsored player. Assistance will vary from tournament entry fees, equipment support, and/or training expenses paid for by the Foundation. At any time, the UTF has approximately 10 players receiving scholarship assistance.
- Wheelchair Programming Support: Through monies donated, and grants written, the UTF provides the money to support the wheelchair tennis program in the state. These funds purchase equipment, court time, and pro time to deliver free programming for most of the wheelchair programs each year.
- Out-of-State Travel Assistance: Junior players competing at the highest level incur high expenses each year for tournament entry fees, hotels, and travel expenses to compete in tournaments out of the state of Utah. To support these players, who represent our great state while they play elsewhere, the UTF provides

end-of-year financial support to help progress each player's tennis career. District tournament play is a requirement to receive this money.

PICKLEBALL

Pickleball is an ever-evolving sport with its post-pandemic spike in popularity. Utah is adapting to the demand for pickleball by offering leagues, tournaments, and other fun pickleball events. Utah has 14 different private pickleball facilities and 100 indoor pickleball courts! Almost every city in Utah has outdoor pickleball courts with approximately 1,000 outdoor pickleball courts! Utah is the premiere place to play pickleball!

Utah Tennis started the Utah Team Pickleball league and had two successful seasons with 250+ players participate. This league is like USTA leagues but with some minor tweaks. League gained a lot of popularity and received great feedback from participants. The 2nd Annual Ardene Bullard Of Love Pickleball Tournament also happened during the last week of July. The pickleball tournament was a warm-up for Utah's biggest tennis tournament of the year! 204 players participated in the 2022 tournament this year compared to 80 players in 2021. 255% increase in tournament participation is super exciting!

Utah Junior Pickleball Organization has also seen amazing growth. To help create a pathway for youth



pickleballers, JPO partnered with DUPR (Dynamic Universal Pickleball Rating). DUPR has over 100,000 unique users and JPO has the biggest youth pickleball club on the DUPR platform! There are 160+ youth players that have DUPR accounts and played in JPO events. JPO ran 6 tournaments with an average of 60 unique players in each tournament! Pickleball is also entering high schools with multiple high school pickleball tournaments in the beginning of 2023. Great things to come!

- Most youth pickleball tournaments had **40-60** unique participants.
- Approximately 250 unique youth pickleball players participated in JPO pickleball events.
- Nearly 400 unique adult pickleball players participated in UTA pickleball events including tournaments and leagues.

"Utah Youth Tennis (UYT) has one mission: To make tennis more affordable and accessible to every child and to provide students the opportunity to participate on a tennis team. We believe strongly in the benefits of organized sports, especially of being on a team.

Tennis for a long time has been exclusive, expensive, and secluded. We are here to bring it to the masses and allow kids the benefits of playing on a team before they get to high school. Tennis is an incredible sport, with so many benefits. It is a relatively safe and healthy sport and is one that can be played for a lifetime. It is an incredibly mental sport and trains students to be strong physically and mentally.

Our programs are open to all students, regardless of previous experience—all are invited. Whether it is someone who is already passionate about tennis and looking for some more organized practice and match opportunities, someone who is brand new and wants to learn the sport, or even someone who just wants something fun to do after school with friends, there is something for everyone."



Utah Youth Tennis was created in Fall 2015 with 15 players and 1 coach. By 2022, UYT supported 3000 players and 150 coaches. Utah Tennis Association recognized UYT with the 2022 Growing the Game award and celebrates this organization's continued growth and outreach.
